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OVERCOMING OFFENCE

Proverbs 18:19

A brother offended is more unyielding than a strong city, and quarreling is like the bars of a castle.

(CEV) **Making up with a friend you have offended is harder than breaking through a city wall.**

Many people in the body of Christ are offended. In churches around the world you will find Christians who secretly harbor an offense. To be **offended** means to feel annoyance or resentment because of a perceived insult or mistreatment. It means to feel slighted, miffed, hurt, or disgruntled because of the actions of others.

A pastor I know told me that most of the problems in his church are “people-problems.” He said, “2% of the people in my congregation take up 80% of my time.” I asked how many of these 2percenters are offended. He said, “The vast majority

of them.” Offended people not only feel troubled; they also usually cause trouble.

Many churches are filled with offended people. Often the problem is a simple misunderstanding. Many times it is a small matter that grows into something bigger. Because of offense some have left the church, never to return. Others have completely fallen away from the faith.

Jesus said in the last days **many will be offended, will betray one another, and will hate one another** (Matthew 24:10). Jesus is actually talking about believers in this verse. We must be living in the last days! There are so many offended Christians.

You need to realize that offence is one of the devil’s favorite weapons. **1 Peter 5:8** says, **Be sober-minded; be watchful. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour.** Peter is writing to believers. The devil is not seeking someone to devour in the world (he’s already devoured them) he’s looking for someone in the church. Notice he prowls around like a lion.

I was watching a television program about lions in Africa. It pointed out that lions can’t attack an entire herd of wildebeest or buffalo, it’s too difficult. Instead, lions look for the weakest in the herd and try to separate him from the rest. Once he’s away from the herd, the lions surround him and pounce on him.

Friend, that’s exactly what the devil does! The enemy knows you are weaker when you’re not in fellowship with other believers. He inspires people, moves them, to say something or do something that annoys you or hurts your feelings. Often these people don’t even realize the devil is using them. But you should recognize the enemy’s tactics and don’t let him gain an advantage over you (see **2 Corinthians 2:11**). Satan wants you to be offended, so that you’ll leave the church. He wants you to walk away from the protection of the flock. But once you’re on your own, he and his demons are going to devour you.



1 Peter 5:8 says be **serious-minded** and **watchful**. We need to be on the look-out, especially for offense. **Ephesians 6:11** tells us, **Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil**. Notice carefully, this verse doesn't say we stand against the *power of the devil*, but the **schemes of the devil**. We stand against the enemy's trickery or clever plans. One of his ploys is to tempt you to be offended – especially over some small, insignificant thing.

Listen, if the pastor publicly berated you from the pulpit, if the deacons were abusing your children – then by all means, leave that church! I'm not suggesting you stay in a church that doesn't practice the love of God. I'm not saying you should remain loyal at all costs. Find a church that preaches the Word of God and accepts you.

But when you've spiritually fed and helped in a church for many years, don't leave just because the pastor forgot to return your phone call. Don't walk away from a place of blessing because Sister 'Zama-zama' didn't shake your hand last Sunday or no one tasted your potato salad at the church picnic!

When you are offended you are angered or distraught because you perceived you have been mistreated or insulted. The key word here is 'perceived'. (Now you may have been treated wrongly. There are some people who, for whatever reason, intentionally want to hurt you. I understand that, but even then, we need to forgive them.)

But often the problem is only in your head. You only imagine that you've been slighted or insulted. You're assuming the person meant to hurt you, but that may not be the case at all. We should give people the benefit of the doubt. Perhaps he didn't mean it the way it sounded. Perhaps he wasn't even aware that what he said offended you. But the enemy will magnify it. The enemy wants you to continue to think about it until it consumes all your attention.

2 Corinthians 10:4-5

For the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh but have divine power to destroy strongholds. We destroy arguments and every lofty opinion raised against the knowledge of God, and take every thought captive to obey Christ.

Notice this passage talks about **strongholds** then **arguments** (KJV says **imaginings**) and finally **every thought**. There is a progression. Thoughts become imaginings and imaginings become strongholds.

It begins with our thoughts. You choose what you think on. Don't allow your mind to meditate on, or to dwell on the wrong things. Take captive every thought that contradicts God's Word.

Thoughts quickly become imaginings. In our minds we see the hurt, we watch it like a video over and over again, we relive it. Imaginings once rooted in our souls become strongholds, an impenetrable fortress that shapes our personality and casts a shadow over our future.

But God's power can uproot and cast down every stronghold. We don't have to stay offended forever!

If you are offended, the first thing to do is recognize it. You can't deal with something if you keep pretending it doesn't exist. And just because it's well concealed, doesn't mean it's not there.

Hebrews 12:15

See to it that no one fails to obtain the grace of God; that no "root of bitterness" springs up and causes trouble, and by it many become defiled.

This verse says some people fail to obtain God's grace. Everything isn't in God's hand; we also have our part to play. God's help is always available, but we have to access it. One reason you don't want to stay offended is that offense can prevent you from receiving the favor and kindness of God.

Offense is often a **root of bitterness**. Resentment buried deep in the soul will eventually **spring up** and cause trouble. And by this many people can become **defiled**. Offense spreads, it's contagious. An offended person can cause others to become offended. Soon half the church is angry. It is important that we deal with it and not ignore it.

We cannot merely suppress the outward evidence of offense. We must dig down and root out the bitterness-but how? There is a marvelous word in the Bible: **forgiveness**.

In **Luke 17:5** the apostles said, Lord **increase our faith!** Jesus had told them to forgive those who wrong you, even 7 times in day. The disciples realized it takes faith to forgive others. And that's correct; we can forgive by faith even if we don't feel we can.

In **v.6** Jesus said, **If you had faith like a grain of mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you.**

How interesting that in connection with forgiveness, Jesus referred to uprooting a mulberry (or sycamore) tree. Here are several interesting facts about sycamore trees.

1. A sycamore tree grows in dry ground but has a deep root system.

Believers are most susceptible to becoming offended when they are dry spiritually. Let's face it; Christians who stay full of the Spirit are rarely overcome by offense. And offense has a greater impact on you than you realize; its roots go deeper than you think.

2. Its fruit is very bitter, only eaten by poor people.

Offense makes life bitter and it will block the prosperity of God.

3. Pollinated by the stinger of a wasp.

The fiery darts of the wicked one bring the offense. If you were stung by a bee wouldn't you immediately try to relieve the pain and reduce the swelling? You wouldn't allow it to go untreated. It's the same with offense. Don't bid your time waiting for the right moment to "get even." Don't allow resentment to slowly burn in your soul, eating away at your joy and souring your life.

4. The wood was used to make caskets.

Unforgiveness brings death. Dismiss the offense immediately. When you forgive another, you're not doing the wrongdoer a favor; you're doing yourself a favor.

Perhaps you feel insulted or that you were not honored. But realize that you can't force people to honor you. In **Esther 3:2**, Haman was antagonized and vexed because Mordecai wouldn't pay homage to him as he passed by. Everyone else bowed down, but this man wouldn't. Instead of overlooking the perceived disrespect, Haman was obsessed with it. It eventually led to his downfall.

Proverbs 19:11

Good sense makes one slow to anger, and it is his glory to overlook an offense.

Your greatness is determined by what you are willing to ignore.

Proverbs 13:10 (KJV)

Only by pride cometh contention: but with the well advised is wisdom.



The real root of offense is pride. If you didn't expect to be treated a certain way, you wouldn't be disappointed and hurt when you weren't. It's better to be unassuming and be pleasantly surprised than to expect to be held in the highest esteem only to be disappointed.

It's better to sit in the lowest seat and have the host elevate you, than to take the highest seat and be demoted by another.

We have to walk in love. (Amp) **Love is not touchy.** Not easily upset, not fragile.

Sometimes the offended person suffers with low self-esteem, that's why he is so devastated at a perceived slight. But if you are secure in your self-worth, you don't need people to appreciate you and gloat over you. Jesus said to the Pharisee, **I do not receive honor from men (John 5:41)**. In other words he didn't crave it or seek it, he didn't need it. He said it is my Father who honors me (**John 8:54**).

This doesn't mean that we should be careless in how we treat others. How others treat you is none of your business, that's between them and God. Your business is how you treat others.

God wants us to be free from offence, and by his divine power to pull down those strongholds.

You can pray this prayer with me:

Lord, I come to you in the name of Jesus. I have been hurt and I have been feeling injured and slighted; not appreciated or treated fairly. But Lord, I choose this day to forgive. I refuse to allow the least bit of animosity or resentment to remain in me. I release the person (or people) who have acted this way; from now on, I don't hold anything against anyone. Father, help me to think on the things that are good and excellent. Give me the strength to walk in love towards those who have not shown me love. For I am determined not to give the devil an advantage over me, I am not ignorant of his tricks. I am free from offense in Jesus name!



भय की आत्मा को तोड़ना

2 तिमथियुस 1:7

परमेश्वर ने हमें भय का नहीं, परन्तु सामर्थ्य, प्रेम और संयम का आत्मा दिया है।

दूसरे अनुवाद कहते हैं परमेश्वर ने हमें डरने का आत्मा नहीं दिया है। डरने का मतलब है साहस या आत्मविश्वास की कमी दिखाना; आसानी से डर जाना। परमेश्वर किसी भी चीज़ या किसी व्यक्ति से डरता नहीं है, और वह चाहता है कि आप भी डरपोक या भय खाने वाले इन्सान न बने। परमेश्वर चाहता है कि हम इस बात को जानते हुए साहस से भरे रहें कि प्रभु की योग्यता जीवन की हर एक परिस्थिति में हमारी सहायता करेगी।

“भयभीत करना” शब्द का मतलब है किसी के अंदर डर पैदा करना। इसका मतलब है किसी को छोटा या महत्वहीन (बिकार) महसूस करवाना; किसी को डरा कर या धमका कर अपने आधीन करना, डर के प्रयोग द्वारा किसी का गलत इस्तेमाल करना। भयभीत करने का मतलब होता है किसी को धमकियाँ देकर काबू में करने की कोशिश करना ताकि वह इन्सान असुरक्षित और खतरा महसूस करे।

मैं आपसे भय की ताकत को तोड़ने के बारे में बात करना चाहता हूँ। हमें दूसरों को डराने की कोशिश

नहीं करनी चाहिए और हमें कभी भी दूसरे लोगों को खुद को नहीं डराने देना चाहिए।

इफिसियों 6:9 हे स्वामियों, तुम भी उनके साथ ऐसा व्यवहार करो। यह जानते हुए कि तुम दोनों का स्वामी स्वर्ग में है और वह निष्पक्ष है। धमकियाँ देना छोड़ो।

यह वचन कहता है कि स्वामियों को अपने नौकरों को धमकाना नहीं चाहिए, कंपनी के मालिकों या किसी भी संगठन के बॉस को अपने नीचे काम करने वाले को धमकाना नहीं चाहिए। एक दूसरा अनुवाद कहता है, “उन्हें डराने वाली बातें मत बोलो।” एम्पलिफाइड बाइबल यह एक बात भी इसमें शामिल कर देती है, “हिंसा वाले व गाली-गलौच वाले शब्दों का इस्तेमाल करना।” हम इन सारी बातों को इस तरह से भी कह सकते हैं, “जो लोग तुम्हारे लिए काम करते हैं उन्हें धमकाओं नहीं।”

अगर इन्सान के लिए कोई काम करना गलत है, तो परमेश्वर के लिए भी वह काम करना गलत है। उदाहरण के लिए, अगर लोगों के लिए झूठ बोलना गलत है, परमेश्वर के लिए भी झूठ बोलना गलत बात है। परमेश्वर के पास कोई दोहरा मापदंड नहीं है। अगर परमेश्वर ने कहा

है कि अपनी बात मनवाने के लिए हमें दूसरों को डराना या धमकाना नहीं चाहिए, इसका मतलब है कि परमेश्वर भी किसी को डराता या धमकाता नहीं है।

हाँ, परमेश्वर का पवित्र भय हमारे मन में होना चाहिए, उसके लिए गहरा सम्मान होना चाहिए। परमेश्वर जो है, उसके लिए हमारे मन में बहुत अधिक श्रद्धा होनी चाहिए। लेकिन परमेश्वर अपने अधिकार का गलत इस्तेमाल कभी भी नहीं करता है। वह डरा कर या धमका कर लोगों को अपने काबू में नहीं करता है। शैतान, और शैतान के प्रभाव में काम करने वाले लोग धमकियों और डर का इस्तेमाल करते हैं, लेकिन परमेश्वर ऐसा नहीं करता है।

प्रेरितों 4:17 “परन्तु हम इन्हें धमकाएं कि वे किसी मनुष्य से इस नाम को लेकर फिर चर्चा न करें जिससे कि यह बात लोगों में और अधिक न फैले।”

यहूदी लोगों के अधिकारियों ने बड़े ही कठोर शब्दों में पतरस और यहून्ना को धमकाया कि वे यीशु के नाम से और अधिक प्रचार न करें। वे डरा-धमका कर प्रेरितों को अपने काबू में करना चाहते थे।

लेकिन पतरस व यहून्ना साहसी थे, और जवाब दिया, “क्या परमेश्वर की दृष्टि में यह उचित है कि हम परमेश्वर की आज्ञा से बढ़कर तुम्हारी बात मानें? क्योंकि यह तो हमसे हो नहीं सकता कि जो हमने देखा और सुना है, उसे न कहें। (प्रेरितों 4:19,20)

दूसरे शब्दों में पतरस और यहून्ना ने कहा, “चाहे तुम लोग कुछ भी कहो हम परमेश्वर की आज्ञा मानेंगे। हम तुम्हारी धमकियों से भी डरने वाले नहीं हैं।” शैतान आपको चुप कर देना चाहता है और आपकी गवाही को खराब कर देना चाहता है। लेकिन आपको पतरस व यहून्ना की तरह हिम्मत वाला बनना पड़ेगा। डर के सामने मत झुको।

21 वचन, और उन्होंने उनको और अधिक धमकाकर जाने दिया। किसी को धमकाने का मतलब उस धमकी को पूरा कर देना नहीं होता है। सादूकी और फरीसी लोगों ने प्रेरितों को डराने की कोशिश की, लेकिन वे कुछ भी नहीं कर सके, तो उन्होंने उन्हें जाने दिया। शैतान बातें तो बहुत बड़ी बड़ी करता है, लेकिन वह आपको तब तक हानि नहीं पहुँचा सकता है—जब तक कि आप डर की आत्मा के सामने झुक न जाएँ;

इसलिए ऐसा मत करें!

कुलिसियों 4:6 तुम्हारी बातचीत हमेशा अनुग्रहमयी और सलोनी हो कि तुम हर एक व्यक्ति को उचित उत्तर देना जान जाओ।

परमेश्वर यह नहीं चाहता कि हम शैतान के जैसे बातें करने लग जाएँ। हमारे वचन अनुग्रह से भरे होने चाहिए, इसका मतलब है दया से भरे हुए, विचारात्मक, और दूसरों को खुशी देने वाले। कठोर और धमकाने वाली बातें बोलकर हमें दूसरे लोगों को अपने काबू में करने की कोशिश नहीं करनी चाहिए।

कभी कभी ऐसा समय भी आता है कि परमेश्वर हमसे कठोरता से बात कर सकता है या हमें डाँट भी सकता है। लेकिन वह कभी भी लोगों को नीचा नहीं दिखाता है। हमारे वचन नमक युक्त होने चाहिए, जो कुछ भी हम बोलते हैं उन बातों को सुनकर लोग सोचने के लिए मजबूर हो जाते हैं। हमारी बातों को सुनकर लोगों को चुनौति मिलनी चाहिए। लेकिन, हमें लोगों को गलत बातें नहीं बोलनी चाहिए और हमारे मुँह से उन्हें बर्बाद नहीं करना चाहिए। सुधार करने का मतलब किसी को टुकड़ाना नहीं है। कुछ लोग ऐसे होते हैं कि किसी भी तरह के सुधार को स्वीकार नहीं कर सकते हैं। हमें बड़ी ही विनम्रता के साथ सकारात्मक आलोचना को स्वीकार करना चाहिए। अगर आप खुद के प्रयासों के बारे में सही तरह से मूल्यांकन नहीं करेंगे, तो आप कभी भी अपने आप में सुधार नहीं ला पाएँगे। लेकिन नाश करने वाली आलोचना चोट पहुँचाती है। यह कोई सहायता नहीं करती है।

मुर्गी के जैसे सिर वाला बनना बंद कर दें और शेर के जैसे हृदय वाला बनना शुरू करें! परमेश्वर कलिसिया में साहस वाली स्तुति आराधना चाहता है। वह दुनिया में हिम्मत वाली गवाही देखना चाहता है। शेर किसी से भी डरते नहीं हैं। अब आपके दहाड़ने का समय आ गया है! परमेश्वर में आपका विश्वास, आपके जीवन के ऊपर से डर की शक्ति को तोड़ देगा।

KEEP YOUR FOCUS



I believe, there are three kinds of people in this world. Bored people-those who complain there is nothing to do. Busy people-complaining that there is TOO much to do. And finally, the blessed people-they are living of what God is doing. Which category do you fit in? Why is it that you sit home all day and complain that you have nothing to do? Or are you so busy that you are running around like a chicken with your head cut off? Or maybe you fall into the blessed category. What is the result of the life you are living? One word: FOCUS. It's not the lack of time...but the lack of direction in your life. You and only YOU are responsible for what you give your attention to.

The Bible says, that the narrow path leads to life (Matthew 7:13). A narrow path is thin, tight, and focused. When you are driving, you must not only have your hands on the steering wheel, but your head must be looking forward, and your mind alert at all times. Are you focused? Or are you giving your attention to things that are less important? Like answering that text when you should be studying or reading the Word? You see, sometimes it's not that we lack focus...but that we tend to focus on what's less important. For example, let's take Esau from the Bible. He came home from a hunting trip and was really hungry. He was so hungry that he traded his birthright for a bowl of soup. It's not that he was not focused; it was because he chose to focus on what's less important. Instead of focusing on the blessing, he chose the soup that will fill him up temporarily. Or let's take Peter during the storm. Jesus told Peter to step out of the boat and meet him. He was focused...he knew he needs to walk

to Jesus...but he let fear break his focus. Don't ruin your life focusing on what's secondary!

Sometimes we surround ourselves with people whose focus is easily broken. Be careful! When their focus is broken, you may lose yours! Judas lost it...Lucifer lost it...Lot lost it...and Joseph's brothers lost it, too. Don't be connected with people that will drag you down with them. Like a tree or a bush...it needs to be pruned to bring more fruit. Pruning is necessary to narrow focus. You need to cut people or things out of your life so you can live a fruitful and focused life. Satan wants to give you soup to take away your birthright. He wants to break your focus from God's blessings and promises. Instead, he sends distractions to keep you away from living a blessed life.

So I encourage you, stay FOCUSED. God has great things planned for you. But if you pay attention to the secondary things, you will always be bored and busy. Live a blessed life that is focused and aligned with God's promises!
